Whereas, the names of these dedicated public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C


Whereas, the 35th Annual Candlelight Vigil is part of National Police Week, which takes place this year on May 13th; and

DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF MAY, THIS YEAR 2023, AS MOTORCYCLE AWARENESS MONTH


