#### Call to Order

The Special Meeting of the Wilmington City Council on December 10, 2019 was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Roy Strong in the Council Chambers of the Wilmington City Hall.

#### **Other Officials in Attendance**

Alderman Vice made a motion and Alderman Combes seconded to approve the Conditional Use Permit for a Planned Unit Development for Fox's Pizza, a Variance to Permit a PUD less than one acre in size subject to the following condition: submittal and City acceptance of an easement to the City/public over the sidewalks proposed along both Mill Street and Main Street

Discussion: Alderman Vice requested that the alley not be used for deliveries. He also added his concerns in regards to safety and the condition of the alley, along with safety concerns of deliveries being made on Main Street. Alderman Vice requested the hours of operation once the business opens, to be 11 o'clock rather than midnight on the weekends and close at 10 o'clock on the weekdays considering there are residents adjacent to the proposed business. Alderman Vice has no objection with having the restaurant just feels some changes need to be made in consideration of the residents in the area. The Mayor was in agreement with the bad condition of the alley and stated that it (the alley) along with Mill Street will be added to the MFT road improvement list. Alderman Vice added that it would not be fair to the residents if the City chose that no parking is allowed on the south side of Mill Street-where would the guest of the residents' park if this restriction was added. Alderman Vice proposed that perhaps instead of planting trees and adding a grassy area this could be blacktopped and used for deliveries. Alderman Vice questioned that since there is going to outdoor seating would a fence need to be installed. Yes, a fence will need to be installed but it would need to be visible/see through for safety purposed, it could not be a privacy/stockade type fence.

#### **Public Comments**

Mrs. Prucha stated before they purchased their home, they called the village and they were told that the empty lot would never be a restaurant, she didn't know exactly the name but someone told her. Mrs. Prucha stated that she didn't have a problem with the pizza place going there but to give him land that's going to encroach on her property, she is not favor of. She stated that there is a safety hazard on street with the Fire Department getting access to her son that has a traumatic brain injury - last year, they were seven times blocking street. Mrs. Prucha stated her concerns with granting a variance and why they should not be given; those being safety, negative effects on peoples lives and home values.

Mrs. Quirk explained that she lives on Kankakee Street and her property backs up to Greg's property, she has no problem with him building the building but has concerns with the safety of the alley and the water runoff. She also expressed her concerns with the off-street parking calling it a stupid idea because there's going to be accidents and she doesn't understand why the building couldn't be designed to all for off street parking.

#### **Ordinance No. 19-12-17-01**

# AN ORDINANCE FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES FOR THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING MAY 1, 2020 AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2021

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILMINGTON, WILL COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** That the sum of \$1,357,897.00 Dollars be and the same is hereby levied and assessed upon and against all property within the corporate limits of the City of Wilmington, Will County, Illinois, subject to taxation, according to the valuation of said property as the same is assessed and equalized for state and county purposes for the fiscal year of said Wilmington commencing May 1, 2020 and ending April 30, 2021, which sum is to be applied in payment and satisfaction of the appropriations heretofore made by the City of Wilmington in **Ordinance No. 19-12-17-01**, passed on the **17**th **day of December, 2019** by the City Council of Wilmington, Will County, Illinois, for all the various funds, agencies, and departments of the City of Wilmington including the general Corporate Fund; Police Pension Fund; Health/Disposal Fund; Emergency Service and Disaster Agency (ESDA) Fund; Federal Insurance Contribution Act and Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF); Auditing and Accounting Fund; Liability and Workmen's Compensation Insurance Fund; Motor Fuel Tax Fund; Bond & Interest Fund.

**SECTION 2:** That the sum of \$1,357,897.00 Dollars is hereby levied and assessed for the following items in the amounts as indicated; that the total appropriation is designated under the columnar heading "Total Appropriation", that the part or portion thereof to be raised from other sources or from taxes previously levied is set forth and described under the columnar heading "Amount to be Raised from other Sources or from Taxes Previously Levied"; and that the part or portion thereof to be raised by taxation is set forth and described under the columnar heading "Amount to be Raised by Taxation":

AN ORDINANCE
FOR THE LEVY AND ASSESSMENT OF TAXES
FOR THE CITY OF WILMINGTON
SPECIAL SERVICE AREA NUMBER 1
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING MAY 1, 2020,
AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2021

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Wilmington, Will County, Illinois:

<u>Section 1:</u> That the total amount of appropriations for the City of Wilmington Special Service Area Number 1 legally made to be collected from the tax levy of the current fiscal year is hereby ascertained to be the sum of thirty-four thousand one hundred dollars (\$34,100).

Section 2: That the sum thirty-four thousand one hundred dollars (\$34,100) being the total of appropriations heretofore legally made that are to be collected from the tax levy of the current fiscal year of the City of Wilmington for City of Wilmington Special Service Area Number 1, as appropriated for the current fiscal year by annual appropriation ordinance of the City of Wilmington for the Fiscal Year 2020, passed by the Mayor and Aldermen of the City at the legally convened meeting of December 17, 2019, be, and the same is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the Special Service Area (other than Lots 6, 11, and 15, for which the tax to be levied by this Ordinance has been prepaid in full) of the City of Wilmington subject to taxation for the current year.

<u>Section 3:</u> That the total amount of thirty-four thousand one hundred dollars (\$34,100) ascertained above, be and is hereby levied and assessed on all property subject to taxation within the City of Wilmington Special Service Area Number 1 (other than Lots 6, 11, and 15, for which the tax to be levied by this Ordinance has been prepaid in full) according to the Special Tax Roll "Exhibit E" of the City of Wilmington Ordinance No. 08-05-06-01 for the current year.

<u>Section 4:</u> That this Levy Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Illinois Municipal Code.

<u>Section 5:</u> That there is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Will County, Illinois, the total amount of thirty-four thousand one hundred dollars (\$34,100.), which total amount the City of Wilmington requires to be raised by taxation for the current fiscal year of the City, and the City Clerk of the City is hereby ordered and directed to file with the County Clerk of the County on or before the time required by law, a certified copy of this Ordinance.
